## Attire and Equipment List

### Bags

Please bring your luggage in two smaller bags as we cannot store regular suitcases for 100 people at the hut in Landmannalaugar so city wear has to be stored in Reykjavik. We will provide locked secure storage room from Thursday morning, September 9<sup>th</sup>.

There is no internet connection in Landmannalaugar, so there is no need to bring Laptops on the fieldtrip.

Business casual (pants and jackets for men, dresses or pantsuits for women)

### Equipment list for the Field Excursion

#### Clothing

- Rain and windproof outer wear (jacket and pants).
- Hiking boots.
- Wool or fleece for inner wear, at least two layers (two sets), NO COTTON, silk is OK.
- Gloves
- Fleece/wool hat
- Few pairs of thick socks (both for hiking as well as comfy socks for the evenings).
- Hiking sandals (Teva or similar) for wearing inside the hut and for running in your swimsuit to the hot spring and crossing rivers if needed.
- Towel and swimsuit, both for outdoor swimming pools in Reykjavik and hot springs in the mountains.

#### Bedding

Sleeping bag and pillow (if you need a pillow) and ear plugs. You will be sleeping on mattresses, mostly in bunk beds, close to each other. This is all part of the charm of mountaineering.

#### Gear

Small day pack for your lunch, water, extra socks etc. Flash light or head light would be good. There is no electricity in the huts. You might also want to bring band-aids (in case of blisters) and aspirin or paracetamol for aches and pains.
